-Informational Tables (on-campus)

- Promote your organization by hosting a table in a key area on campus so students can stop by and speak to you about your organization and/or positions.

-Meet and Greets (on-campus or virtual)

- Connect with students on-campus or in a virtual setting.
- This virtual session will be moderated by Career Development. After a brief Career Development introduction, employers will discuss information about the organization, current and potential future jobs/internships, how candidates can learn more or apply to positions. Questions and answers with students and/or moderator. Session can be recorded to be shared with students.
- Sessions should last a maximum of 15 minutes, depending on student attendance and questions.
